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#### A Note About ELAA for Fall 2021

Dear Counsellors, Career Practitioners, Teachers, and Educational Support Staff,

#### Hello!

Due to the ongoing Covid-19 Pandemic, things will look a little different for ELAA this year. We are moving forward with a hybrid format for this fall, with virtual events (including Counsellor Update) held in September, and we are hopeful to be visiting schools in-person starting in October (health restrictions permitting).

We are using a similar platform to last year, 6Connex Launch, which closely mimics what attendees expect at an ELAA fair. Students will enter our virtual environment, connect with the booths that interest them, and ask questions to recruiters who are waiting and ready to provide live responses. This year, students will get an opportunity to browse our 28 member institutions' content and chat with them from the comfort of their homes!

As our in-school contact, you will oversee promoting virtual events and, if applicable, the in-person event for your school. We have included in this document an example of what you may want to send students/parents to prepare them. Just do your best to encourage students to register in advance, attend the event, and ask questions the same as they would at an in-person event. Students can collect documents like viewbooks or other forms in the booths by adding it to their briefcases. They should download any items in their briefcase so that it is saved to their computers before the event ends.

The virtual event space will open at the scheduled time and close shortly after the posted end time, giving students the allocated time to browse booths and chat with recruiters. If they miss out on talking with representatives at the booths, they should collect some contact info from the booths so they can follow up after! Students do not need to stay for the whole event and are welcome to come and go as they please.

If anyone runs into challenges they can navigate to the lobby where there is a help desk. A member of the ELAA executive team will be ready with some technical help, if needed. If you have any questions leading up to events, please contact us at info@elaa.ab.ca!

#### About ELAA

#### About the Educational Liaison Association of Alberta

The Educational Liaison Association of Alberta (ELAA) was established September 13,1982, to provide exposure to Post-Secondary opportunities for rural Alberta students, an underserved population at that time. Today, ELAA is comprised of 25 publicly-funded Alberta Post-Secondaries, Prairie College, the Canadian Armed Forces and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police with the goal of exposing all students in the province to the post-secondary opportunities offered through our members. In 2018, over 122,000 students had the opportunity to explore the possibilities offered by our member institutions at one of 140 ELAA events!

#### How an ELAA schedule is typically planned

Early in the new year, ELAA's Alberta Post-Secondary Events (APSE) Coordinators begin the process of planning the upcoming Fall travel schedule. Feedback is compiled and analyzed, dates are determined for large, centralized events and a skeleton schedule is created with weeks we'll be in which regions, including dates for large events. Once we have the skeleton, the APSE Coordinators look at the regions to determine an effective travel route avoiding unnecessary/redundant travel. At this point, the APSE Coordinators reach out directly to schools to see if they would be interested in hosting an ELAA event. While there may be some flexibility in when ELAA can offer an event at a certain location, our travel schedule often limits how flexible we can be. Once a host has indicated interest in an ELAA event, we ask for additional details (parking, number of students, additional schools attending, etc.) for the event which assist recruiters who will be attending. The APSE Coordinators collect and accept this information as confirmation of being able to host the event, and it is published on the website for ELAA members to see.

#### Interested in hosting an ELAA event?

Over the years, ELAA has tried several ways to engage schools and organizations who may be interested in hosting an ELAA event. We've found the most successful way is the direct approach – reaching out via phone or email. If you're interested in hosting an ELAA event and haven't been contacted, please email aspe@elaa.ab.ca to get the conversation started!

#### Covid-19 Changes

We are moving forward with a hybrid format for this fall, with virtual events (including Counsellor Update) held in September and we are hopeful to be visiting schools in-person starting in October (health restrictions permitting). Please promote both the virtual and in-person events for your students, as many institutions will have Open Houses and other events for prospective students that may occur before your school's event.

Visit <u>elaa-launch.6connex.us/event/VirtualELAA/student/register</u> to register (in advance or day of). Attend the event by visiting <u>elaa-launch.6Connex.us/event/VirtualELAA/student/login</u> during event times. Attendees will be able to visit booths, talk with live recruiters, and collect viewbooks (in df format) like normal! Please note that they will not be able to access the event outside of fair hours.

#### Using this Guide

As you look through this guide, it is important to remember the most accurate and up-to-date information will always be available directly from an institution, either on their website or by contacting them directly. Every institution operates independently, meaning information and business processes are specific to each institution. Please refrain from generalizing and/or making assumptions about an

institution based on information and understanding about another. While this guide has been reviewed for accuracy, ELAA strongly encourages you to verify information with the institution.

#### Tips for Virtual ELAA Events

In a typical year, we appreciate when we see you chatting with students and directing them towards our booths to ask questions when they may be feeling a little shy or overwhelmed. For virtual events this September, that will look a little different. We thought we would include a couple ideas for how you might engage your students in this unusual year.

- Create an assignment for students to make sure they attend and participate.
  - Have an assignment sheet where they have to log which booths they connected to and what program they asked about.
  - Provide some guiding questions to get them started but make sure there is room for them to ask other questions so that they think for themselves what they want out of a post-secondary program or institution.
- Help with registration while in class.
  - To make sure your students are registered, have them go through the simple process while in class with you.
- Send notifications to students and parents.
  - Include ELAA event information in your school's newsletter, social media, announcements, and/or information screens.
- Register yourself for the event and chat with students by adding them to chat in the bottom right corner.
  - This is one on one primarily and won't work for addressing your entire student body as there are several schools attending each event, not just yours.
  - You can notify your students that you will be attending the event and with your name they can search you in chat and connect with you too. This will allow you to help students find schools to speak to...or encourage them to ask around at each booth since they won't have to worry about lines like in typical years!

#### **Tips for In-Person ELAA Events**

- Keep us informed any health and safety requirements at your school, such as mandatory masking or pre-screening questionnaires.
- Complete the confirmation form from the APSE Coordinators. This provides recruiters important information about parking, location of the event, anticipated number of students attending and more.
- Reserve an appropriate space. Space should be large enough to accommodate ELAA members attending as well as the students (gymnasiums or other large, open spaces are generally appropriate). Unless otherwise indicated to you by the APSE Coordinators, please provide one table per institution.
- Promote the event to students and teachers to ensure a significant turnout.
- Check who's registered for your event by visiting the event page on the ELAA website.
- Prepare your students. Encourage students speak to all institutions, even if they've never heard of or considered an institution, as they may find opportunities they were unaware of.

- 30 minutes prior to the start of the event, recruiters will arrive and begin to set up. Please ensure the space is appropriately prepared and free of students until the start of the event as this allows all recruiters to be set up and ready-to-go when the event begins.
- Connect with the on-site weekly coordinator. The ASPE Coordinators will let you know in advance who the weekly coordinator is and what institution they are from, and the coordinator will introduce themselves to you prior to the start of the event. The coordinator is your on-site contact for the event – let them know about any last-minute changes and they'll let you know if any recruiters will be delayed.
- Be mindful of the scheduled event end time. If you have a specific requirement for the time/length of the event you're hosting, please work with the APSE Coordinators during the planning process.
- Give us your feedback. Your feedback is crucial in ensuring we're able to continue providing
  value in connecting your students to the opportunities offered by our members. We want
  feedback not only about hosted events, but also changes you're experiencing which may
  impact how you're able to connect students to post-secondary opportunities. Please complete
  the feedback form from the APSE Coordinators after an event hosted at your school or reach
  out at any point to let us know your thoughts.




